Governance

During the year the Board has initiated a governance review. We sought external support to help the board look again at its role, membership and duties. This is leading to a renewed sense of strategic direction.

Over the coming months the Board will be

- Updating and clarifying our mission, the impact we seek, and our values
- Reviewing the membership of the Board, seeking new trustees where necessary
- Evaluating the long-term strategic options open to us

This has been an invigorating experience, as the Trustees confirm their commitment to working with the children, young people and families in South Kilburn.

Over the coming year we will

- develop and start implementing a concrete plan to secure the long-term financial and operational viability of the organisation
- continue to strengthen our existing services, and the processes that support them

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objectives of the charity are the promotion and encouragement of the Christian faith by applying the capital and income of the company without distinction for or towards all or any of the following purposes:

- maintaining activities for children and young people in Kilburn
- establishing and maintaining activities for children and young people there or in other places
- providing office and residential accommodation for the wardens club leaders and other workers for the said activities whether full time or part time workers; and
- training and instructing persons in the leadership of such activities as aforesaid

The charity achieves the above objectives through the operation of the OK Club.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

The trustees have referred to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's aims and objectives and in planning its future activities. In particular the trustees consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives of the Charity.


Overview

During the year the OK Club has continued to run a programme of youth and children's activities, from our own premises and elsewhere locally. We have a small staff team supporting and training a larger group of volunteers, some of whom live on-site in Christian Holt House (CHH).

Youth and Children's Work

Between 1st April 2014 and 31st March 2015 we recorded 3,050 attendances at various sessions, by 208 different children and young people. These regular sessions offered a range of sports, arts, and social activities, as well as cooking and eating together, gardening, and discussion times.


Both children's and youth activities were well attended; Junior Club, for primary aged children had slightly fewer attendances than the cumulative total of youth sessions.




Our ethnicity data is incomplete, as sharing the information is voluntary (around 1/3; from the data we do have around 65% of attendances were by young people from Black British backgrounds; locally around 40% of residents (all ages) are Black British (Census 2011). Overall boys made up around 60% of our membership, and 70% of attendances. We will continue to target activities at girls and young women to try and increase their participation

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE – continued Schools Work

We have continued to work in primary and secondary schools during the year. Our Youth Worker, Jeronne, has been mentoring young people at St. Augustine's secondary school. Teachers have referred young people who would benefit from additional support, which in a number of cases has helped them to avoid exclusion from school and make positive targets for themselves.

Our Children's Worker has also run a series of sessions at St Mary's Primary School. The Identity Project helped the children to creatively explore topics such as 'Who Am I?' and 'Getting To Know You', in the context of the changes in their lives as they prepared for secondary school.

We also worked with the Family Liaison Officer to run anti-bullying workshops with years 1 through 6. The children wrote an action song, did role plays and discussions about the power of words.

Partnership Work

Over the summer we carried out a series of projects with NCS Challenge Network. Groups of 15-18 year-olds from other parts of London came to lead music, media and sports sessions at Club. As well as providing additional activities in Kilburn, the young people leading the sessions gained hands-on leadership, teamwork and social action experience.

We have also worked with South Kilburn Trust and a group of local parents to start a small social enterprise offering additional maths tuition for key stage 2 children. These are currently well attended after school maths classes, and the parents hope to extend to also support English, and parents alongside their children.

Thanks

None of this would be possible without the staff and volunteers who work extremely hard in Club, and our financial and prayer supporters. Many give regularly, which is extremely helpful for planning; we are also thankful to all who responded to specific needs during the year.

It is always encouraging to meet a number of our prayer supporters at our annual Prayer Day, held on the first Saturday in March.

In particular we would like to thank Roger Foster-Smith, Joanna Burdett and Becky Foreman who have all stood down as trustees, or announced their intention to do so, during the year.

We would like to offer our thanks in particular to Brent Council, the Tom Ap Rhys Pryce Memorial Trust, and the Charles Hayward Foundation for their support during the year.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity where feasible to maintain unrestricted funds which are the free reserves of the charity, at a level which equates to approximately three months' staffing costs. This provides sufficient funds to cover management and administration and support costs.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

Sustainability

We are keen to ensure that our work becomes as self-sustaining as possible for the future. WE have continued to hire our building more and more, and this has resulted in a rising of the profile of the building and its potential to provide a service to people of the community. Furthermore there has been more interest in renting out the building on a regular bases to local community organisations. Alongside this we have been applying for funding bids which will help us to continue the work in the local area

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Land and buildings - 2% on cost Plant and machinery etc - 20% on cost

Taxation

As a registered charity the Club benefits from rates relief and is generally exempt from Income Tax and Capital Gains Tax, but not from VAT. Irrecoverable VAT is included in the Statement of Financial Activities within the cost of those items to which it relates.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Acorn Fund

This fund represents funds raised for the redevelopment of the Club during 2004-2006.

The Club receives various grants and donations for specific projects which are detailed in the notes to the financial statements.
